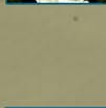

# FEATURED WORKSHOPS

## "Student-Led Student Ministry: Pipe Dream or Possible?"

It's trendy for youth ministers to say, "Youth ministry is not about ministering to youth, but about empowering youth to minister," but what does youth-led youth ministry actually look like? Experience youth ministry by young people as NYC students discuss recent student-led ministry models including God Belongs in My City, Kickin' It Old Skool, Generation Xcel, and World Vision's Youth Empowerment Project.

## Youth Ministry Beyond the Walls: Overcoming Injustices and Rebuilding Communities"

"I the Lord love justice" (Isaiah 61:8). How then can youth ministries lead the struggle to overcome injustices such as poverty, crime, institutionalization, and educational inequity that conspire everyday against urban youth and erode urban communities? What role can youth ministries play in restoring the shalom of our cities by advocating for and manifesting Biblical justice in the communities beyond our church walls?

## WORKSHOPS

### [101] Reaching High-Risk Youth:

One in four youth are deemed at-risk of not developing into healthy adulthood. What works for the majority of kids in a youth ministry generally doesn't work with these kids. Can we offer them more than "three strikes and you're out?" Learn proven models of programming to effectively reach them with the Gospel.

### [101] (2-Part) The First Two Years of Urban Youth Ministry:

If you're new to youth ministry or need a fresh start, this one's for you! You may be asking questions like: Where do I begin? What is most essential? What are the best ways to build a volunteer team? How can I better connect with youth in the church and beyond the four walls? Learn a step-by-step process for mapping out your first two years in urban youth ministry.

### [101] Don't Waste Your Creativity: Writing Inspiring Lessons that Challenge the Heart:

Up to eighty-eight percent of children who grow up as professing Christians will denounce their faith by the second year of college. Youth pastors and teachers have an incredible opportunity to shape the lives of the next generation, "warning everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone mature in Christ" (Col. 1:28). This workshop explores writing lessons that will challenge hearts, producing hunger and obedience to God in a crooked world.

### [201] Prophetic Youth Ministry: A Holistic Model for the Urban Context

Based on the work of Fernando Arzola Jr. in his book, *Toward a Prophetic Youth Ministry: Theory and Praxis in Urban Context*, this biblically-based, holistic model for urban youth ministry flows out of the conversation between Jesus and an expert of the law where Jesus answered him, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind"; and, "Love your neighbor as yourself."

### [201] Stress in the City: Beating Burnout in Urban Ministry

This workshop takes an honest look at the stress, trauma, and burnout that come with living and ministering in the city. You'll leave with all sorts of practical, research-based tips to help you find your own personal and spiritual relief in the midst of pouring yourself into others. Learn how to move from stress in the city to resting in the Kingdom.

### [301] Youth Ministry = Team Ministry: Keys to Building Local Youth Events and Regional Coalitions

Building a strong local youth ministry requires a team of powerful servant leaders. These leaders can work together to build an ongoing life changing youth experience both within a local church/organization, or involving several local ministries. Learn principles on planning and organizing a one-time event, ongoing service, or even a coalition between youth programs to work together to influence a city.

### [301] (2-Part) Moving From Youth Ministry to Community Transformation

Urban Youth Ministry is traditionally focused on working with individual youth, but so often our efforts are sabotaged by the unhealthy environment where our kids and families live. In this workshop, we will examine CCDA's proven biblical approach to restoring urban communities that works to create healthy neighborhoods where youth and their families can not just survive, but thrive as agents of God's redemptive work in the cities of our nation.

### [401] (2-Part) Youth-Adult Partnerships: Mobilizing Your Youth as Agents of Change

This foundational training describes our approach to transformational development where the role of children and youth is paramount-both as beneficiaries and as change agents in the development around them. Learn how to build youth programming in the context of community, while your teen leaders are simultaneously discussing the "value" of community impact

### Mission Critical: Reaching a Generation One School at a Time

Adults promise children that if they stay in school they will be equipped to succeed in life, but we have failed to make good on that promise for generations -- with high school graduation rates in some cities hovering at or below 30%.
